NEED TO BUILD EVIDENCE

Social protection is a human right. Therefore, the decision to develop a social protection floor to ensure a fairer and more inclusive society is primarily a political decision. However, implementing a social protection floor has a cost and therefore demands political decisions to increase fiscal space.

In order to convince national stakeholders of the importance of investing in the development of a social protection system, there is a need to develop evidence on the impact of social protection on economic growth and society, as well as in terms of the return on investment governments can expect. The establishment of social protection systems also impacts enterprises, necessitating the need for further documentation of the interdependence between the provision of social protection and business performance.

PROMOTING SOCIAL PROTECTION THROUGH EX ANTE MODELS

An ex ante impact evaluation attempts to measure the intended impacts of future programmes and policies. The development of ex ante models using existing empirical evidence on the impact of social protection programmes could be used to inform national dialogues intended to define a national strategy on the progressive establishment of a social protection floor. These models could also make significant contributions to defining scheme parameters, maximizing potential positive impacts at micro/individual, mezzo/community, and macro/country levels.

Based on work developed as part of a long-standing partnership with Maastricht University, the ILO's Social Protection Department can continuously update its ex ante models and develop complementary analyses to support its constituents in the establishment of social protection floors.



DEVELOPING EMPIRICAL EVIDENCE USING EX POST EVALUATIONS

Ex post evaluations measure the impacts on beneficiaries attributable to programme interventions. Ex post evaluations have immediate benefits and reflect reality, making them very important as evidence supporting arguments for the establishment of social protection. The ex post evaluations document the impact of social protection on reducing poverty, attenuating inequality, vitalizing local economies, and so on. These evaluations, however, sometimes fail to explain the underlying reasons for the success or failure of programmes.

In collaboration with the Global Business Network for Social Protection Floors, the ILO's Global Flagship Programme will carry out ex post evaluations to document the impact of social protection on businesses.

EXAMPLE OF A RECENT ILO RESEARCH¹: LINKING THE PROVISION OF SOCIAL PROTECTION WITH THE ODDS OF CLOSURE

In an era of globalized competitive pressure, most employers in developing countries do not provide social protection benefits to their employees. This study tests the presumed argument that such provisions threaten firm survival by increasing labour costs. The findings suggest that increased compliance to social protection labour standards (social protection compliance) is associated with reduced odds of factory closure. This result implies that increased social protection compliance can enhance the well-being of workers while maintaining a firm's competitiveness.
