




ILO projects generate direct deliverables or **outputs** (e.g. reports, trainings)

Portion of the population receiving benefits from tax-funded scheme







> ILO's contribution to the outcome

a) The ILO supported the preparation of the draft policy paper on maternity protection informed by the principles of ILO's Haternity Protection Convention, 2000 (No. 183) and by inputs received from the Government. and the social partners, which included ILO-facilitated basing on maternity protection to constituents. The ILO further supported and undertook an actuarist valuation of proposed benefits and supported the development of communication materials to strengthen the capacity of social partners to engage effectively in advocacy and social dialogue. This work facilitated the contribution of the tripertitle partners on the draft Maternity Policy Framework, as well as the incorporation of maternity protection losses within the draft National Social Protection Bill of The LO supported the development of the ZAPO's strategic plan through the provision of technical assistance. Subsequent training on the use of the Disability Management Information System (DMS) was also supported by the ILO. The above work made significant contributions towards capacity building within the ZAPO. The work on the Assessment Tools - which relies on current international principles on inclusion and good practice from other similar country contexts - will build the capacity of the ZAPO to align their work with international labour standards and to help the Government and other relevant stakeholders better categorize the different levels of disability.

s Gender equality component

The draft National Social Profession Bit mirrors the Government's intent to improve working conditions for women and vulnerable workers through the extension of social protection coverage to the informat. economy, including for example domestic workers, and through the introduction of contributory maternity and patentity protection based on the social insurance financing model, hence reducing potential. discrimination of women in accessing the labour market. Progress in integration of people with disabilities in the labour market contributes significantly to avoiding discrimination in the workplace.

The results achieved are underprinned by the principles and provisions in the ILO's Social Protection Floors Recommendation, 2012 (No. 2022), the Social Security (Minimum Standards) Convention, 1952 (No. 2022), and the Maternity Protection Connection, 2000 (No. \$83), as evidenced by the support ILO provided in developing a series of Technical Notes highlighting key issues for consideration in the draft BILL

The ILO supported tripertite consultation processes throughout the development of the draft National Social Protection Bill. The ILO piezed a pivotal and strategic role in organizing tripertite consultation processes. that led to comments and suggestions put forward by the social partners subsequently being integrated into the draft SIII. This included the development of position papers by the workers and employers' organizations, and other consultations which helped to develop a Consensus Building Matrix aimed at quitting further high-level tripartite dialogue on the draft legislation.

Since May 2017, and additional 4g0000 workers of larger enterprises were registered in the scheme. Thus, as of October 2018.1.4 million workers of larger enterprises were registered in the scheme.

People impacted: 910,000

As of August 2017, approximately 910.000 workers were registered in the scheme, amongst whom about 600,000 had paid the contribution and were entitled to use services with the contracted public health facilities, and approximately 100,000 workers per month are now accessing health services through this scheme.







Government decrees extended eligibility to the contributory schemes, operated by the National Social Security Fund, covering healthcare and occupational injury extending legal coverage to an additional 3 million workers whose workplaces employ eight or fewer employees and were previously excluded from coverage. By September 2018, the total workers of SMEs registered under the scheme was approximately 1.7


