Why is social protection key for business?

Performance: Social protection improvise working conditions and leads to **lower absenteeism, greater productivity, and reduced turnover**. Higher social protection benefits contribute to attracting and retaining talent and improving the corporate image.

Predictability: Social protections systems are based on risk sharing and solidarity. They increase **peace of mind by transforming the risk into a predictable contribution amount**. They are ultimately less costly than "employers' liabilities" whereby the employer has to bear the risk in full.

Continuity: Social protection systems **protect enterprises during crises such as COVID-19**, by allowing infected workers to stay at home (sickness benefits) and maintaining business continuity despite reduced activity (partial unemployment benefits). They prevent social unrest that can be detrimental to the business environment.

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From jobs to decent work: integrating job creation and social protection
