QUESTIONNAIRE FOR ESSPROS DATA USERS

Introduction

In the context of future revision of the European System of Integrated Social Protection Statistics (ESSPROS), we would like to involve users of ESSPROS data in deciding which improvements should be given priority. The following short questionnaire (15-20 minutes) will help us to better understand why and how you are using the ESSPROS data, how this data meets your needs, your assessment of the quality of the data and associated products (publications, database and website) and which part(s) of the system you would like to see improved.

What we collect

ESSPROS aims to provide a comprehensive and comparable dataset on the social benefits provided to households and their financing among European countries (the 28 EU Member States plus Iceland, Norway, Switzerland and Serbia). Social benefits are transfers to households, in cash or in kind, intended to relieve them from the financial burden of a number of risks or needs, which are categorised in ESSPROS “functions”: disability, sickness/health care, old age, survivors, family/children, unemployment, housing and social exclusion.

ESSPROS is composed of a core system, which collects data on gross expenditure and receipts, and two modules. These deal with the number of pension beneficiaries (seven categories of pension are covered) and net social protection benefits (i.e. the value of social benefits after deducting taxes and social contributions that may be payable on them). In addition to this quantitative data, ESSPROS collects qualitative information describing the social protection schemes in each country and quality reports on the data collected through the core system and each of the two modules.

ESSPROS data are collected according to Regulation (EC) No 458/2007 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 25 April 2007 on the European system of integrated social protection statistics¹ and a series of other Commission regulations which cover:

- In relation to the ESSPROS core system and module on pension beneficiaries:
 - o definitions, detailed classifications and dissemination rules².
 - o the results to be transmitted, the transmission format, and criteria for measuring quality³;
- In relation to the module on net social protection benefits:
 - o definitions, and schedule for the launch of the full data collection⁴;
 - o the results to be transmitted, the transmission format, and criteria for measuring quality⁵.

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Section 3.4: Net benefits data (restricted approach)

Net social protection benefits refer to “the value of social protection benefits excluding taxes and social contributions paid by the benefits’ recipients complemented by the value of fiscal benefits” where fiscal benefits are defined to be “social protection provided in the form of tax breaks that would be defined as social protection benefits if they were provided in cash, excluding tax breaks promoting the provision of social protection or promoting private insurance plans”⁶.

There are two approaches to the measuring net social protection benefit expenditure. The first of these is referred to as the “restricted approach”. This defines net social protection benefits as gross social protection benefits less taxes and social contributions, paid on those benefits by their recipients and implies no change to the scope compared to the Core system. Data following this approach are already being collected on a regular basis.

Section 4.1: Net benefits data (enlarged approach)

The second approach to measuring net social protection benefit expenditure is the “enlarged approach”, which builds on the restricted approach by incorporating the effect of fiscal benefits. This potentially enlarges the scope of ESSPROS compared to the Core system because it includes the value of social benefits provided solely through the fiscal system. Fiscal benefits reduce the amount of taxes and/or social contributions paid on all forms of income (e.g. from employment) and therefore increases the disposable income of beneficiaries in addition to the social benefits recorded in the Core system. Moreover, fiscal benefits may accrue to persons who receive no social benefits paid in cash or in kind who are therefore not members of the population of recipients covered by the Core system.
