## 1. Introduction

The National Strategy for Social Protection (NSSP) 2021-2030 was approved by the Council of Ministers on 11 November 2021 and published through Government Resolution No. 132/2021 of 9 December.

The approval of the NSSP 2021-2030 is a crucial step to strengthening the social protection system in Timor-Leste. The National Strategy aims to promote an integrative, appropriate and sustainable progress of the social protection system in order to efficiently extend the social protection coverage to all citizens and maximize the impact of social protection on the reduction of poverty and vulnerability, consolidating the fundamental rights and guarantees of the country's citizens.

By 2030, Timor-Leste aims to achieve the end of poverty, promote peace, ensure access to healthcare, education and other essential services, as well as adequate care for children, the elderly and the disabled, and protect the population from social and economic risks, thereby ensuring a decent living standard for all Timorese citizens.

The Strategy aims to achieve three strategic objectives:


- (1) Reducing poverty;
- (2) Improving and expanding social security for workers;
- (3) Institutional development

In order to ensure the success of the NSSP, it is necessary to develop and put into practice mechanisms and instruments to support its implementation, guiding the action of the Ministry of Social Solidarity and Inclusion (MSSI) and its partners to execute the priority activities defined, allocate adequate resources and consider appropriate deadlines, as well as to ensure progress monitoring and evaluation of the Strategy's implementation.

For this purpose, it is crucial to develop annual implementation plans between 2022 and 2030 that will serve as essential guidelines to detail which priority activities should be undertaken for each of the strategic objectives, progress indicators for each activity, beneficiaries, responsible entities, timeframe and resources. The annual plans also include the Strategy's Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) mechanisms.

The mechanisms and instruments developed for the first Annual Implementation Plan shall be used until 2030, even though they can be adjusted or complemented according to any needs that may arise over time. These instruments, in turn, will also help the institutional strengthening of the MSSI and other partners, allowing budget planning activities to be more efficient, more integrated and more aligned with the cycle of the general state budget.

This document presents the first NSSP Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) for the biennium 2022-2023. Its structure comprises the present introduction, followed by section 2, which addresses the priorities for 2022-2023. Section 3 presents the priorities of a good governance system for this period, while section 4 focuses on the NSSP Monitoring and Evaluation system. Finally, section 5 presents the financial framework for the aforementioned biennium.



# 2. Implementation priorities for the biennium 2022-2023

This section presents the activities relevant for the biennium 2022-2023 within the 12 priority areas, and the three priority objectives set out in the NSSP 2021-2030. For each activity, there is a brief description indicating the type of activity, to whom it is addressed, the responsible entity, partners, main indicators, targets, outcomes, and timeframe.

Regarding the type of activity, each activity is classified as "improvement" when it refers to an aspect that is already covered and will be improved. Activities related to new initiatives or which will be implemented for the first time will be designated as "new" only for this biennium. Subsequently, new activities will be divided into "new for widespread application" or "new for experimental application" when referring to pilot and

experimental initiatives or projects, or activities targeting a limited group of beneficiaries.

The results achieved in these priority areas of intervention will be supported by other priority areas, particularly those foreseen in the second and third strategic objectives, ensuring a joint and articulated action. The monitoring and evaluation system to be established according to the third strategic objective is paramount to ensure an appropriate follow-up of priority policy areas and their respective activities and the evaluation of the outcomes. The monitoring and evaluation system is, therefore, an essential tool to ensure the efficient, effective, sustainable and durable implementation of the NSSP 2021-2030.



### 2.1 STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE 1 - Reducing poverty

This strategic objective reflects the need to ensure the realization of the rights of all citizens, including the most vulnerable and those living in poverty, preserving a minimum level of well-being throughout their lives. Therefore, it also safeguards the realization of one of the central pillars for the construction of social citizenship in Timor-Leste.

This strategic objective is subsequently divided into five priority areas of intervention:

- 1.1: Expanding support to the most vulnerable groups
- 1.2: Improving the system of social cash transfers
- 1.3: Increasing nutrition support
- 1.4: Facilitating access to healthcare and education
- 1.5: Strengthening disaster prevention and response





## 3. Good Governance

The effective and efficient implementation of the NSSP requires a constant dialogue, cooperation, and coordination between all implementing partners. The Strategy foresees the creation of a good governance structure at political, operational management and technical levels that is truly representative of all bodies responsible for social protection. This structure should particularly ensure the involvement of social partners, associations, and other civil society representatives, in liaison with the legally competent public authorities, in the construction, strengthening, and improvement of the social protection system.

#### **Governance Structure**



The National Council for Social Protection (CNPS) is the coordinating body, responsible for monitoring and evaluating the social protection strategy and policy proposals on issues related to the development, dynamization, and expansion of the social protection system.

The CNPS is led and coordinated by the Prime Minister's Office and includes all the bodies responsible for social protection, including representatives of social partners, associations, and other civil society representatives, in liaison with the legally competent public authorities with responsibilities in the area of social protection.

The CNPS is supported by an Executive Secretariat for Social Protection (SEPS), under the technical coordination and leadership of the MSSI, comprising a representative from each ministry involved in the NSSP development and implementation process, including a representative of the National Institute of Social Security.

The SEPS is responsible for preparing the annual and multiannual implementation plans, operational management and monitoring of the NSSP implementation, and for providing technical support to the CNPS in decision-making processes. The SEPS monitors the implementation process of policies, programs and initiatives developed within the social protection system, aiming to ensure the accomplishment of NSSP objectives and priority activities, the mobilization of adequate resources, the fulfillment of implementation deadlines, and the regular monitorization of the outcomes.

The SEPS may also issue recommendations to the CNPS regarding program implementation and make recommendations to replace, improve or accelerate the procedures in place to validate or measure processes.

Given the importance of monitoring and evaluation for the strategy's success, the SEPS will designate the establishment, roles, and activity of a cross-sectoral group responsible for developing a monitoring and evaluation system of the NSSP.

Establishing a good governance structure, such as the one presented, is regarded as one of the activities under Objective 3, "Institutional Development", including priority area 3.3 aimed at establishing a Monitoring and Evaluation System.

The governance structure will be developed and implemented based on the following key drivers of good governance:

- integration of the various representatives of ministries and other public entities, social partners, development partners, donors, and civil society organizations, to ensure a better coordination of policies between the various government areas throughout the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation process;
- commitment to provide a broad, representative, and participatory consultation process;
- streamlined policies focused on a set of priority areas and priority activities;
- mobilization and involvement of all actors at different levels of intervention; and
- creation of knowledge, enhancing access to and sharing of information.

Under the scope of the NSSP Implementation Plan for the biennium 2022-2023 and given the importance of the good governance mechanisms foreseen, the Monitoring Tracking Sheet presented below serves as a guiding matrix for the expected outcomes, priority activities, targets, deadlines, resources, and responsible entities. This form aims to assist in the effective and timely implementation of the Good Governance system.

## 4. Monitoring and Evaluation

The importance of Monitoring and Evaluation (M&A) for the effective and successful implementation of the NSSP implies the creation of an NSSP Intersectoral M&E Group (GIMA), presented in the previous sections under the priority objective of Institutional Development and Good Governance. It also requires the creation of M&E mechanisms to enable regular progress monitoring of the Strategy implementation and to produce the necessary evidence and knowledge to inform the various policymakers, social protection operational managers, and other actors and partners, learning and integrating the knowledge generated throughout the process.

In addition, the M&E mechanisms of NSSP implementation will be established to complement and support the planning, budgeting, and implementation processes in line with the General State Budget (GSB).

The flowchart below shows the steps of M&E, responsible entities, and expected deadlines.

## 4.1. Monitoring and Evaluation System


The process of monitoring and evaluating the implementation of the NSSP aims at checking the implementation of policy measures and assessing their impact on the accomplishment of the strategic objectives Poverty Reduction (Obj1), Improving and Expanding Social Security for Workers (Obj2), and Institutional Development (Obj3), as well as their contribution to global development objectives.

The process of monitoring and evaluating the implementation of the NSSP is also a fundamental mechanism to provide essential information in order to improve policy measures, whether in their design or implementation, as well as to reinforce the responsibilities and capabilities of the various actors involved. M&E requires working partnerships, preserving a clear distribution of the responsibilities in the different stages of the process.

The process of monitoring and evaluating the implementation of the NSSP is based on a **monitoring system** supported by several types of indicators:

- Indikador nasional no indikador hirak ne'ebé sei asegura komparabilidade internasional;
- -National indicators and other indicators to ensure international comparability
- -Indicators of outcomes for each of the strategic objectives and, where applicable, targets set out in the Strategy.
- Indicators to monitor the implementation of policy measures, used to measure the progress achieved in their implementation.

This system includes a Monitoring Tracking Sheet to be used by the entities with responsibilities in the Strategy's implementation as a working basis.



The Monitoring Tracking Sheet (see Annex 6.1 – Excel File) allows the collection of information and data on the implementation of priority activities and to measure the progress achieved on a quarterly basis. The Monitoring Tracking Sheet includes the following fields:

- 01. Code: code assigned to the result level concerned
- 02. Level of result: outcome, output or activity
- 03. Description of result: description of what is expected for each level of result
- 04. Indicator: what indicator will be used to measure each type of result
- 05. Indicator definition: definition of the selected indicator
- 06. Unit of measurement: type of measurement for each indicator
- 07. Disaggregation: whether the indicator can be disaggregated or not, and if so, the type of disaggregation
- 08. Target group/beneficiaries: who will benefit from the measures/programs
- og. Means of verification: how the result will be verified
- 10. Main responsible: main entity responsible for achieving the result
- 11. Partners: other entities that will support the main entity responsible to achieve the result

- 12. Initial status: baseline data for comparison and measure progress
- 13. Source of information of initial status: source of information for the baseline data
- 14. Targets: what was set out to achieve for each year
- 15. Targets' calculation: explanation of how targets were established
- 16. Progress: data by quarter and annual
- 17. Notes: comments on quarterly and yearly data
- 18. Estimated cost: initial estimated costs for each result level per year
- Budget: amount of the approved budget for each result per year
- 20. Budget gap: amount identified if the budget amount is not enough to cover the estimated cost
- 21. Budget execution: how much was executed per year

In terms of responsibilities, GIMA plays a central role in the tasks related to M&E, particularly:

- Preparing monitoring and evaluation tools;
- Coordinating with M&E focal points of the different entities/ departments involved;
- Sending the Monitoring Tracking Sheet to the responsible entities/departments;

- Collecting information and data on each of the activities from the responsible entities/departments;
- Harmonizing and validating the data collected in the Monitoring Tracking Sheet completed by the different entities/ departments;
- Systematizing Monitoring Tracking Sheet;
- · Collecting other information and statistical data;
- Analyzing information and data;
- Drafting the text for the Annual Implementation Report;
- · Revising the Annual Implementation Report;
- Submitting the Annual Implementation Report for valuation and approval.

### 4.2. Evaluation reports

The NSSP M&E system also includes additional mechanisms to assess the strategy's progress and generate knowledge on the operational and technical processes that support the work of the MSSI and partners in implementing social protection programs and the policy decision process of the CNPS.

Two types of evaluation will be used to assess the Strategy: regular evaluation as well as intermediate and final evaluation. As part of the regular evaluation, a regular progress assessment report shall be produced in the form of Annual Implementation Report of

the NSSP. As part of the intermediate evaluation, an Intermediate Evaluation Report shall be produced. For the final evaluation, a Final Report shall be produced.

#### Regular evaluation

- Annual Implementation Report of the NSSP, which will present the Strategy's progress according to its structure. It will also include a specific section addressing knowledge generation and dissemination (lessons learned and best practices), and a section on cooperation with partners. GIMA prepares this report. GIMA shall submit this Report to the SEPS for their comments and evaluation. The SEPS approves the Report and submits it to the CNPS for their knowledge and assessment before the end of December.


#### Intermediate and final evaluation

- Intermediate Evaluation Report of the NSSP, to be submitted in 2026 and, based on the results of previous annual reports, will assess the effectiveness and efficiency of the Strategy and may issue recommendations to correct and improve activities for the remaining period, if necessary. This Report may be prepared internally by GIMA and SEPS or outsourced to an external contractor. The Report should then be submitted by the SEPS to the CNPS for evaluation and approval by the end of December 2026.
- Final Evaluation Report of the NSSP, to be submitted in 2030, is expected to present the final results of the NSSP implementation, assess its effectiveness, efficiency, and sustainability. This Report shall be prepared by an independent

external entity. The Report should then be submitted by the SEPS to the CNPS for evaluation and approval by the end of December 2030.

### 4.3. Dissemination of information

The Annual Implementation Report as well as the Intermediate and Final Evaluation Reports should be widely disseminated and, if possible, published. The dissemination will help to generate knowledge, as well as to strengthen accountability and transparency within the NSSP.







A selection of good practices shall also be disseminated on an annual basis in order to generate and internalize knowledge on social protection.

# 5. Financial Framework

The NSSP 2021-2030 includes a chapter analyzing the impact of the Strategy implementation on the costs and number of beneficiaries after the introduction of amendments in the main social protection programs, such as Bolsa da Mãe, Merenda Escolar, SAII, and the introduction of new provisions, e.g., for children with disabilities or maternal and child benefits (see Chapter 4 of the NSSP).

The reforms to the NSSP proposed and examined in this chapter represent the most ambitious scenario of the NSSP, assuming its full implementation by 2030. The implementation plans should present a detailed analysis of the costs related to the implementation of the NSSP to identify which of the proposed changes can be executed each year in order to achieve full implementation by 2030.

The amendments planned until 2023 are expected to increase the number of beneficiaries by approximately 150,605 (from 672,485

to 823,090 beneficiaries). The increase in cost for 2023 is estimated at 1.5% of non-oil GDP and 2.6% of public expenditure, adding up to a total of 4.7% of non-oil GDP and 8.3% of public expenditure, respectively.

However, one of the activities to be carried out under this AIP is related to an update of the estimated values presented in the NSSP, using the cost estimation model developed by the International Labour Organization known as Rapid Assessment Protocol (RAP). The need to update these figures results from the need to update some economic projections according to more recent data (such as the data from the latest Labour Force Survey) and also to account for some of the amendments proposed, namely the Bolsa da Mãe Jerasaun Foun program, the amounts of which have been adjusted.

It should also be noted that the Monitoring Tracking Sheet mentioned in sub-chapter 4.1 will include cost fields (estimated cost, budgeted cost, budget gap, source of funding) to be completed by the various entities/departments upon GIMA's request. Annex 6.2 shows an example of the financial information to be collected.


