Coming from the Ministry of Women, Youth, Children and Family Affairs in Solomon Islands, the themes of the workshop's many sessions are not only relevant but valuable as well.

As a small country, Solomon Islands as also Vanuatu, has many challenges especially of the human capacity working in the related and relevant organizations. This affects the implementation of activities such as the initiatives of the Solomon Islands Decent Work programmes. Other challenges include geographical isolation and lack of good communication systems in the countries.

We in the Solomon Islands (and true for Vanuatu also) can only work within our limited human capacities and by noting our challenges. There is always a lot to work on.
