### **Being Unemployed**


- People are actively seeking and available but out of work or job/business opportunity

#### As of July this year...


7% of the labor force are unemployed







#### Youth Unemployment





#### Youth not Studying, Not at Work















#### **Unemployment across Regions**

# Unemployment, compared with the rest of ASEAN

- In terms of levels, Philippines is relatively high
- In terms of percentage change between 2005 and 2011, is one of the slowest to decrease

#### **Patterns and factors**

- Boom-bust cycle in employment
- Disconnect between economic growth and employment growth
- Transition from school to work
- Mismatch between jobs and workers available

### **Tripartite Challenges**

While promoting sustainable and inclusive growth, increasing levels and opportunities for employment, implementing active labor market policies...

> Establishing an expanded social protection floor



#### Commitments

- Study the possibility of setting up an unemployment insurance scheme as the workers' income floor in case they lose their job and which allows time to find a new job while unemployed
- Intensifying social dialogues among workers, employers and relevant government agencies to achieve such aim

#### Commitments

Develop alternative schemes of social security initiatives which may include: promoting firmbased retirement program, promote workers cooperative in the community for mutual protection programs, and supporting indigenous insurance schemes (e.g. microinsurance/paluwagan, micro-finance

LEP 2011-2016

#### Commitments

Exploring creation of mutual or provident funds for vulnerable workers or a possible social amelioration fund similar to sugar for selected industries (construction, plantation, agriculture – banana, pineapple, rubber)
