

# Social Protection in Egypt: Renewing the Social Contract

December 9, 2015, Semiramis Hotel

This workshop seeks to discuss the role of social protection in the country and the government's strategy to renew the social contract and promote social justice.

During the workshop, the government will have the opportunity to present its various Social Protection initiatives and highlight the economic and social challenges that Egypt is facing.

The short presentations and the interactive panel discussion will allow the government to clarify the various components of its social protection strategy and how they complement each other. It will also highlight the existing gaps in the Egyptian social protection system in order to clarify the steps the Egyptian government could take to ensure the protection of its most vulnerable citizens.

A central objective of the workshop will thus be to initiate dialogue between Egyptian government representatives and development partners, in order to understand what these next steps could be and where donors and partners can best support the Egyptian social protection strategy.
